Sherman Tegtmeier is a thirty-year-old horse trainer located at Burchard, NE. He has lived in Southeast Nebraska his entire life where he currently lives with his wife, Sarah Jo Tegtmeier. He has grown up with horses starting in 4-H as a youth then moving on to competing on a National level in the NRHA. From there, he started training professionally in 1996 and has been active in more than ten associations.

Sherman is a multiple world champion exhibitor, trainer and coach. He has shown, trained and coached world champions in five different associations and holds numerous year-end and circuit championships in over ten different associations. At his training facility in Burchard, NE, he trains full-time starting colts, training reining horses, giving lessons, coaching all levels of competitors and competing. He has worked for the past ten years building a successful horse training business with a large client base. He has satisfied customers from fifteen states.

The goal at Sherman Tegtmeier reining horses is to produce world class reining horses. Breeding, training and showing are the first steps. The program is continued through promoting the stallions, developing breeding programs, coaching owners and building a long-term program for the individual's goals and needs.

Besides training, Sherman is active promoting the sport of reining where he is President of Central Plains Reining Horse Association. He has been President for five years and continually works to promote the sport of reining through horse shows, clinics, breeders programs, and award programs. Sherman is an active CPRHA member who has grown up in the CPRHA. Sherman started competing in 1991 as a youth and then "climbed the ladder" as a Rookie, Non-Pro and then moved on to professionally training and competing in the Open.

Sherman is the author of a new video series designed to teach the fundamentals of training and showing reining horses. The five video series covers the basics of getting started in reining and covers the technical details of training and showing the finished show horse.
